JNHE Judges

Jimmy Linthicum

Owned heifers

Jimmy Linthicum, Welch, Okla., was born and raised on his family's farm in Maryland. He started in the cattle business in 1955 with a registered polled Hereford herd. In the late 1960s, Jimmy turned his focus to custom fitting, specifically the production of show steers, heifers and bulls, which have gone on to win at national, state and local shows. In 1977 Jimmy expanded his efforts with the addition of JCL Cattle Services, which produces registered Limousin cattle under the JCL prefix.

For the last 30 years Jimmy has had the opportunity to evaluate cattle at shows throughout the U.S. and abroad. While developing his own Limousin program, Jimmy continues to assist registered cattle breeders exhibit at major livestock shows throughout the U.S.



Mark Core

Bred-and-owned heifers, bulls and cow-calf pairs

Mark Core, his wife, Deb, and their two daughters — Bailey and Kennedy — own and operate Core Farms, a purebred Maine Anjou operation located near Pleasantville, Iowa. An Iowa native, he has been involved in the cattle business his entire life. Mark showed Hereford steers and heifers in 4-H and FFA.

Mark graduated with his bachelor's degree in agricultural education from Iowa State. While attending college, he was a member of the national champion livestock judging team in 1986. Mark has a long history in judging major livestock shows across the nation, such as several breed and pen shows in Denver, along with Ft. Worth and San Antonio.

Mark currently serves as the vice president of agricultural operations and marketing at Vermeer Manufacturing.



Brad Winegardner

Steers

Brad Winegardner, his wife, Melanie, and their two children — Tyler and Ashlie — own and

operate Winegardner Farms, a diverse crop and cattle operation located near Lima, Ohio. While in high school Brad began his career in the cattle industry.

Brad has judged many livestock shows across the nation and has exhibited nine national champions at shows including Denver, Louisville and Ft. Worth.

The Winegardner family farms more than 1,000 acres of grain and operates a successful cattle business. They raise predominantly Chi-Maine crosses. The herd is comprised of more than 50 mother cows. Besides the show cattle and farming operation, Brad manages an 800-head feedlot. The family hosts an annual female sale each November.

Tom Hawk

Senior and intermediate showmanship

An Illinois native, Tom Hawk, his wife, Mandy, and their 4-year-old son, Jess, own and operate Hawk Herefords, Earlville, Ill. Tom has been involved in the Hereford business for 12 years. The couple started Hawk Herefords in 2001, which has grown to include 30 registered Hereford cows and 30 recipient cows.

In 1995 Tom was hired as manager of River Ridge Farm, Sheridan, Ill. In this position he continued to develop his passion for Hereford cattle and the showing.

Along with Hawk Herefords, Tom and Mandy are involved with Mandy's family's farming operation, which includes corn and soybeans. Tom also works in the crop protection industry as an account manager for Rosen's Inc., a national ag chemical distributor.



Cody Helms

Senior and intermediate showmanship

Cody Helms, Taylor, Neb., developed an interest in exhibiting cattle at an early age as

he began showing steers while growing up in Colorado. After he was too old to participate in 4-H and jackpot shows he turned to National Junior Hereford

Association (NJHA) events to continue in the showing.

Cody's family is no stranger to the Hereford business; his grandparents, Clarence and Lois Helms, owned Helms Polled Herefords, Holbrook, Neb.

Cody attended Sterling Junior College and participated on the livestock judging team. He completed his bachelor's degree in animal science at Colorado State University.

Upon graduation Cody went to work for Upstream Ranch, Taylor, Neb. Besides overseeing the show string, Cody is involved in all aspects of the ranch work including calving, breeding, haying, harvesting and preparing for the Upstream Production Sale.

Peewee and junior showmanship

Cody Lowderman oversees the daily operations of Lowderman Cattle Co., a purebred Hereford operation in Macomb, Ill.

Cody attended Black Hawk East Junior College where he earned an associate degree in animal science. He was a member of the national champion 4-H livestock judging team and was also named the high individual in the junior college and senior college competitions at the North American International Livestock Judging Contest.

Cody earned his bachelor's degree in animal science at Michigan State University (MSU).

Cody has recently attended auction school and assists his family with their auction business, while also working the ring at sales throughout the country.

Cody enjoys working with youth activities and joining with his family to support the activities of the NJHA and the Illinois Junior Hereford Association. He has judged shows at the local, state and national level in numerous states and in Canada.

Contest and Scholarship Information

Outstanding Herdsman Award

This award will be presented to one National Junior Hereford Association (NJHA) member during the Junior National Hereford Expo (JNHE). A nomination committee will observe exhibitors throughout the week and nominate individuals accordingly. The nominees' fellow exhibitors will make the final selection during a ballot vote prior to the JNHE awards ceremony.

Golden Pitchfork Award

This award will be presented to one state association during the JNHE. The Golden Pitchfork Award was developed to encourage junior exhibitors to work together in the display of their cattle, as well as to create state pride during the JNHE. It is presented to a state association that displays a combination of cleanliness, uniformity in stalling (such as exhibitor cards, panels, etc.) and additional decoration of the area representing the state.

Hereford Bowl

The primary objectives of the Hereford bowl are to allow NJHA members to demonstrate their knowledge of Hereford cattle, show good sportsmanship, and to provide an educational experience for both participants and spectators in a quiz bowl format.

Judging Contest

Contestants can compete individually as peewees, juniors, seniors or adults. Awards will be given to the top four-member junior and senior teams and high individuals in each division.

Showmanship Contest

Contestants are judged on appearance and showmanship ability except for the final round of the senior division, where animal grooming is also evaluated. Divisions are peewee, junior, intermediate and senior. Youth do not have to show their own animal, except for peewees, who must show their own or one owned by an immediate family member. The animals exhibited in the contest must be entered in the JNHE.

Team Fitting

All contestants must be members of the NJHA, as well as members of the state www.hereford.org

junior association they are representing. The three-member teams should be made up of at least one peewee, one junior and no more than one senior. Teams will have 45 minutes to fit their heifers for a panel of judges. A team must provide their own animal and supplies.

Team Marketing

The main objective of this contest is to encourage team participation while promoting the importance of communication skills, marketing technique and an understanding of performance and pedigree information. Each state may enter one junior and one senior team. Each team will try to convince the judges that they should purchase the team's entry by discussing pedigree and performance information, as well as visual characteristics.

Illustrated Speech Contest

Sponsored by the National Organization of Polle-ettes (NOP) in cooperation with the NJHA. The contest's objectives are to develop character and leadership in Hereford youth while stressing education to stimulate and promote interest in the beef industry and to project Herefords in a positive image. The AHA must receive entries by July 1. There is no specific topic; however, speeches must relate to the beef cattle industry.

Peewee Speech Contest

Peewee speech is strictly a participation activity for NJHA junior members up to 9 years of age. The NOP, in cooperation with the NJHA, sponsors this contest.

Photography Contest

Photographs should include Herefords or an activity related to Herefords. This contest is sponsored by the NJHA and *Hereford World*, and offers several different categories for entries. Please refer to the official rules list for complete information regarding the photography contest.

Promotional Poster Contest

Sponsored by the NJHA, the objective is to promote the JNHE in Louisville, Ky.

State Scrapbook Contest

The purpose of the junior association scrapbook is to provide a year-to-

year record of the association and its members' activities. Judging is based on completeness and content, artistic balance and eye appeal, and originality of material selected for inclusion.

Outstanding State Member

One junior member in each state with junior participants at the JNHE will receive this award. Awards are made in cooperation with state junior associations. Judging of individuals should be based on sportsmanship, cooperation with fellow participants/guests, attitude and work habits. Individual states will conduct their own counting of votes and relay the state winner's name to the NJHA board of directors on official ballot.

State Advisor of the Year Award

This award recognizes one of the most important groups of people contributing to the success of the state associations and ultimately the success of the national junior organization. Each state junior Hereford association is encouraged to nominate their advisor(s). Nominations are due at the AHA Youth Activities Department by June 1.

Junior Golden Bull Award

Three Junior Golden Bull awards will be presented during the JNHE. The award is a Junior Golden Bull bronze trophy and is sponsored by the American Hereford Women (AHW) and the NJHA. Applications should be sent to the AHA, postmarked no later than May 1.

Prospect Award

The AHW and the NJHA sponsor this award. One Prospect Award for each grade, levels 3-8, will be presented annually at the JNHE. Applications must be sent to the AHA, postmarked no later than May 1.

Ed Bible Memorial Scholarship

NJHA members who graduated from high school during the current school year or are students in a post-secondary school are eligible. Scholarship criteria and applications are available from the NOP directors.

Junior Merit Award

The Junior Merit Award is designed to recognize outstanding college-age junior members and to provide them with further higher education opportunities. The award encourages individual and cooperative effort, enthusiasm, excellence, leadership and achievement, and singles out those who are promising Hereford breeders and beef industry members. Applications must be submitted to the AHA by June 1. To receive an application, contact the AHA Youth Activities Department.

Walter and Joe Lewis Memorial Award

The Walter and Joe Lewis Memorial Award is one of the most coveted awards a junior member can win at the JNHE. Three finalists are recognized for overall

achievement in leadership, teamwork, skills and competition. Selection of the award winner relies on a point system for participation in junior programs and activities. To be considered for the award, juniors must complete the application and return it to the AHA Youth Activities Department by June 1.

John Wayne Memorial Scholarship

The Hereford Youth Foundation of America (HYFA) and the AHW award two \$750 college scholarships to NJHA members who make outstanding contributions to agriculture and the Hereford industry.

Pro-Performance Breeder Award

The Pro-Performance Breeders established this award in 1995. The purpose of the award is to recognize

junior Hereford breeders who utilize performance records in their breeding programs and to acquaint junior members with the advantages of performance programs.

Poll-ette Founders Scholarship

This scholarship honors the women who laid the foundation for the NOP. Two \$750 scholarships are awarded to NJHA members, one male and one female, to continue financing their education.

Herdsmen Scholarship

Sponsored by HYFA in cooperation with Hereford herdsmen, the Hereford Herdsmen scholarship honors young men and women who take great pride in exhibiting and presenting their Hereford cattle at junior Hereford events. Two scholarships are given. **HW**
