Historic Hereford prints for sale

Show your support of Hereford youth and get a piece of history when you purchase a set of beautiful prints being offered by the Hereford Youth Foundation of America (HYFA). The original Anxiety 4 and Silver oil-on-canvas paintings currently grace the



walls of the AHA and, in an effort to preserve the authentic artwork, limited-edition canvas prints were made and sold at "The Harvest" event last summer.

The Giclee prints generated close to \$25,000, and now HYFA is offering 11x14 prints of the historic bull and female. The prints can be purchased as a set or individually today at HerefordYouthFoundation.org. The set is \$50, or each individual print is \$30.

The Anxiety 4 bull is credited as the father of American Herefords and was imported in the early 1800s by Charles Gudgell and Thomas A. Simpson of Missouri. The Silver cow is the matron of the breed and was the first registered Hereford cow in England dating back to 1742, when Benjamin Tomkins, the primary founder of the



breed, bred a bull calf out of Silver to two cows, Pidgeon and Mottle. The paintings were commissioned by AHA in 1953 by artist Herman de Jori to hang in the halls of the AHA. They were painted from early drawings with colors typical of early English prints.
