Two delegates from each state junior Hereford association voted these individuals onto the board.

At the awards banquet July 18, four retiring board members announced the election results and passed on their maroon jackets and responsibilities to the new leadership. After each retiring address, the board member took off his or her jacket and presented it to a new director. 
