

Hereford Juniors Awarded Scholarships and Achievements Awards

Outstanding Hereford youth were awarded numerous scholarships during the 2020 VitaFerm® Junior National Hereford Expo (JNHE) in Kansas City, Mo. The Hereford Youth Foundation of America (HYFA) and the National Hereford Women (NHW) awarded \$27,500 alone at this year's JNHE and will award a total of \$200,000 in 2020 to deserving junior members to aid in their academic endeavors.

Prospect, Junior Golden Bull and Golden Bull Achievement Awards

The Prospect and Golden Bull Awards recognize individuals for their involvement in the Hereford industry, agriculture and their communities. The NHW and the National Junior Hereford Association (NJHA) sponsor these awards. Prospect Awards go to students in fourth through eighth grades and the Junior Golden Bull Awards go to students in ninth through 12th grades.

Prospect winners are given a leather halter with a nameplate, while the Junior Golden Bull winners receive a bronze Hereford bull statue. The Golden Bull Achievement is given to collegiate students. These students receive a bronze Hereford bull statue and a scholarship.

House and a local retirement home. Bryden was selected as the champion intermediate showman at the 2019 NJHA. Bryden won the Walter and Joe Lewis High Point Senior Award.

Faith Benedict, 10, is the daughter of Chad and Becky Benedict. Faith has been a member of the Illinois Junior Hereford Association (IJHA) and the NJHA for four years. During the 2019 JNHE, she served as the Illinois state table coordinator and a campaign assistant for a junior board applicant and participated in the judging contest. Faith won the fourth grade Prospect Award.

Noah Benedict, 20, is the son of Chad and Becky Benedict. Noah was elected to the NJHA board of directors in 2019, while also serving as the Illinois Junior Hereford Association (IJHA) president. In that same year, he was recognized as the IJHA outstanding junior member and exhibited the champion bred-andowned heifer at the IJHA Preview Show. Noah received the third-place National Junior Merit Award and the second-place Poll-ette Founders Scholarship.

Molly Biggs, 18, is the daughter of David and Marianne Biggs. She is an 11-year member of the NJHA and currently serves on the Illinois Junior Hereford Association board of directors. Molly has competed in the showmanship, judging and quiz

bowl competitions at JNHE. She won the 2018 NJHA Fed Steer Shootout champion pen-of-three purebred Hereford steers. Molly won the 12th grade Junior Golden Bull Award.

Sam Birdsall, 15, is the son of Dennis and Heather Birdsall. He has been a member of the NJHA for 13 years and spent nine years with the New York Junior Hereford Association, where he served as the president. Sam and his family recently moved to Wyoming, where he is now a member of the state's junior association. He has competed at nine JNHEs and represented the Wyoming Junior Hereford Association in the intermediate division of the public speaking contests at the 2020 JNHE. Sam won the ninth-grade Junior Golden Bull Achievement Award.

Kendall Boatman, 13, is the daughter of Tom and Tammy Boatman. The seven-year member of the NJHA also is a member of the Illinois Junior Hereford Association and the Wisconsin Junior Hereford Association. Hattie served as a voting delegate at the 2018 and 2019 JNHE. Hattie is also very active with the Indiana Junior Hereford Association. She won the second-place National Junior Merit Award and a Golden Bull Achievement Award.

Brandt Downing, 21, is the son of Scott and Tracy Downing. Brandt has been actively involved in both the NJHA and the Oregon Junior Hereford Association (OJHA). The 14-year NJHA member served on the 2017-2020 NJHA board of directors and has been the treasurer, vice president and president for the OJHA. He won the Charles E. Boyd Scholarship and the Hereford Herdsman Scholarship.

Chesney Effling, 18, is the daughter of Chris and Kristi Effling. She currently attends Kansas State University and studies animal science. She is a 12-year member of the NJHA. In 2019 Chesney exhibited the reserve grand champion cow-calf pair and the grand champion bred-and-owned bull at the JNHE in Denver. She won a Golden Bull Achievement Award.



Ben Jensen, 20, is the son of Kevin and Sheila Jensen. He has been an NJHA member for 13 years and has bred and raised Hereford cattle for 15 years. Ben served as an Agriculture Ambassador and the president of the Young Farmers & Ranchers Club while at Butler Community College. He has served as a director for the Kansas Junior Hereford Association and has been treasurer for three years. Ben won the Hereford Herdsman Scholarship.

Brady Jones, 11, is the son of B.J. and Kim Jones. Brady has been an NJHA member since 2015. He has served in several leadership roles through the Wisconsin Junior Hereford Association and has competed in the speech, showmanship and judging contests at the JNHE and was part of the champion fitting team at the 2017 JNHE. He won the fifth-grade Prospect Award.

Lauren Jones, 16, is the daughter of B.J. and Kim Jones. Lauren has been a member of the NJHA and the Wisconsin Junior Hereford Association (WJHA) for nine years. She has served as the WJHA treasurer and secretary and was a WJHA princess. Lauren was a member of the 2016 junior national planning committee and the 2017 JNHE champion fitting team. She won the 11th-grade Junior Golden Bull Award.

Dylan Kottkamp, 18, is the son of Dale and Lesli Kottkamp. He is an 11-year member of the NJHA and is the vice president for the Indiana Junior Hereford Association. In addition to showing cattle, he exhibits swine, sheep and goats. At the JNHE he has competed in showmanship, Hereford Bowl and the Certified Hereford Beef® Cook-Off. Dylan won a Golden Bull Achievement Award.

Montana Lawrence, 21, is the daughter of Bryan and Marytina Lawrence. The eight-year NJHA member was elected as chairman for the junior board at the 2020 JNHE, after previously serving as the NJHA membership chairman. She was also president for the Minnesota Junior Hereford Breeders Association. Montana received a John Wayne Memorial Scholarship and a Poll-ette Founders Scholarship.

Wyatt Lawrence, 20, is the son of Bryan and Marytina Lawrence. Wyatt is a fourth-generation Hereford breeder and started his own herd at 10 years old. He serves as president for the Minnesota Junior Hereford Breeders and is a junior director for the NJHA. Wyatt won the first-place National Junior Merit Award.

Lauren McMillan, 18, is the daughter of Kyle and Jodi McMillan. Lauren is actively involved in both the NJHA and the Illinois Junior Hereford Association (IJHA). At the Illinois Preview show in 2019, she exhibited the reserve grand champion owned polled Hereford heifer and reserve grand champion bred-and-owned Hereford heifer. Lauren has attended the NJHA Faces of Leadership for the past five years. She is the vice president and awards chairman of the IJHA and was elected to the NJHA junior board of directors this year. She won a Golden Bull Achievement Award.

Regan Mitchem, 18, is the daughter of Wayne and Crystal Mitchem. Regan is a 7-year member of the NJHA and serves as the North Carolina Junior Hereford Association president. She won the 2018 Intermediate Illustrated Speech Contest and has taken part in several NJHA activities, including the Faces of Leadership conference. Regan's champion Hereford heifer was named the supreme overall female at the 2018 North Carolina State Fair. Regan won the Bud Snidow Award.

Cady Pieper, 15, is the daughter of David and Dana Pieper. She has been an NJHA member for 8 years. In 2019, Cady participated in the individual sales contest at the JNHE in Denver. That year she was also a member of the second-place overall junior division livestock judging team. Cady exhibited the champion Hereford heifer at the 2019 Kansas Junior Livestock Show. She won the 10th-grade Junior Golden Bull Award.

Kristin Waters, 11, is the daughter of Glen and Kyla Waters. She has been a member of NJHA since 2013. She has been involved in several leadership activities on the state and national levels. At the JNHE, Kristin

has participated in the judging, team sales and prepared public speaking contests. She won the sixth-grade Prospect Award.

Harlee Watson, 13, is the daughter of Matt and Melinda Watson. She is a member of the Kentucky Junior Hereford Association, where she serves as secretary. Harlee has shown at the JNHE for six years and exhibited the champion cow-calf pair at the 2018 Kentucky State Fair. She won the eighth-grade Prospect Award.

Rusty Wolf, 18, is the son of Tim and Peggy Wolf. Rusty has been active in 4-H and FFA. In his FFA career, Rusty served as his chapter's alumni relations chair, sentinel and secretary, while also serving as a regional sentinel. Hannah Williams, 20, is a 12-year member of the NJHA and studies at Kansas State University.
