ALL CATTLE

• All cattle showing at the Junior National Hereford Expo (JNHE) must be accompanied by a certificate of veterinary inspection (CVI) documenting official animal ID and all required tests and certifications including current accreditation number if applicable.

CATTLE FROM WITHIN WISCONSIN

Cattle from within Wisconsin have no requirements for tests.

CATTLE FROM OUTSIDE WISCONSIN

Wisconsin has no reciprocal agreements with other states regarding the use of tattoos and registration numbers as identification. As a result, breed association tattoos and breed registration numbers are NOT accepted as official identification. In addition, brands are not accepted as official ID.

Acceptable ID's for all cattle from outside Wisconsin include:

- USDA metal ear tag number that is part of the National Uniform Eartagging System (NUES)
 - 15-digit "840" tags (visual or RFID)
 - Valid only if applied before March 11, 2015:
 - Manufacturer-coded RFID tag 15-digit number with the first three digits in 900s
 - American ID tag 8 to 12-digit number prefaced with "USA"

BRUCELLOSIS REQUIREMENTS FOR CATTLE FROM OUTSIDE WISCONSIN

• No current Brucellosis vaccination or testing requirements.

TUBERCULOSIS REQUIREMENTS FOR CATTLE FROM OUTSIDE WISCONSIN

Texas and Michigan's TB Free Zone

• All cattle, regardless of age, will be required to have a negative individual TB test within 60 days of entering Wisconsin.

OR

- If the Texas or Michigan animals originate from a currently accredited TB-free herd, individual TB tests are not required but the accreditation number and date of the last whole-herd TB test must be on the CVI.
- All states (Except Texas and Michigan) no special TB testing is required.
- Cattle from MICHIGAN'S MODIFIED ACCREDITED (MA) ZONE (COUNTIES OF ALCONA, ALPENA,
 - MONTMORENCY, AND OSCODA) currently require:
 - Negative whole-herd TB tests within 12 months before arrival in Wisconsin for all animals 1 year and older
 - Negative individual TB tests within 60 days before entering Wisconsin regardless of age
 - Must return directly to the state of origin after the show, and there must be a statement on the CVI that they will be doing so
 - Import permit. Information on obtaining an import permit:

CATTLE FROM CANADA
